## Emboss Resist Instructions

### Instructions:

1. Fold the Baja Breeze Cardstock using a bone folder.
2. Stamp a random snowflake pattern on your Glossy Cardstock using Versamark.
3. Cover cardstock with clear embossing powder, tapping off excess and heat to melt powder. Let stamped images cool down.
4. Use Stampin' Sponges to add ink on top of glossy cardstock in a swiping or circular motion until you have nice, bold coverage.
5. Wipe off snowflakes with paper to take off excess ink and make the snowflakes "pop" better.
6. Adhere glossy cardstock to Midnight Muse mat using SNAIL Adhesive.
7. Cut a piece of ribbon just a bit longer than the Midnight Muse cardstock and adhere ends to back

of layer.

8. Cut a smaller piece of ribbon and loop under ribbon and tie a knot; pull fairly tightly.
9. Stamp "Believe" in Baja Breeze Ink on the scrap of Whisper White Cardstock - punch out with the Decorative Label Punch and sponge Baja breeze ink on edges. Attach to the card with Stampin' Dimensionals.
10. Add faceted button with glue dot on one of the snowflakes. Finish off with a few Rhinestones!
